- To aid in the recovery and rehabilitation of wounded service men and women.
- To assist in the modification of housing to accommodate disabled veterans.
- To assist the families of wounded service men and women.
- To facilitate the transition of wounded service men and women back into civilian society.

About the Organization

Cindy McGrew began a mission of hope in September 2004. At the time, Mike Russo, now vice president of Operation Second Chance (OSC) was stationed in Iraq as an International Police Advisor. Cindy read updates on his unit through the Stryker News website. When Cindy learned about soldiers from the SBCT that had been wounded and were being transferred to Walter Reed Army Medical Center (WRAMC), she wanted to help. She corresponded with the families to offer her support and assistance. Cindy went to WRAMC, met with the injured soldiers and their families and realized the need for daily assistance to all wounded veterans. The mission of OSC began with Scott Thorne, Mike Oreskovic and Travis Majors.

Cindy began visiting families at the request of the other wounded veterans she had met during her daily visits. Soon, word spread throughout the hospital and outpatient facilities - the time had come to recruit help for assistance with her endeavors.

Debbie and Alaina Sacramo joined Cindy in her daily visits to the hospital in November 2004. The three would visit with heroes and their family members, picking up groceries, clothing and any other essential items that were needed to make their stay more comfortable. Beyond immediate needs, they also provided play pens for families with children, took food orders from local restaurants and brought in movies and handheld DVD players to provide entertainment. Friendships began to develop with the wounded veterans and their family members, making the trip to WRAMC part of their daily routine.

During December 2004, Sue Harrington helped facilitate the Boxes for Heroes campaign which later evolved into the ongoing Care Packages for Heroes program. All four women reached out to their families, friends, coworkers and communities for donations to assemble the care packages. The boxes were filled with snacks, magazines, hygiene items and clothing. Each box was hand delivered to the wounded heroes at Walter Reed during the holiday season.

In March 2005 it became evident that this simple mission among four women could become something much larger than any of the individuals involved imagined. Ride Allegheny offered a fundraiser for the wounded heroes, Freedom Ride 2005, thus creating the need for a non-profit organization. The foundation for Operation Second Chance, Inc. was thus established in March 2005. OSC received 501 (c) 3 status, effective March 16, 2005.

As the organization has grown over the years, additional board members were added to support the mission of OSC. Shelly Harlow, Mike Russo, Bob McKee, Angela McKee, Frank Mielenz and Kathleen Quinn all provide support to the organization.

Annual Fundraisers

Golf Tournament

Each October, Operation Second Chance (OSC) hosts a golf tournament in Montgomery County Maryland. Up to 34 foursomes participate, including wounded veterans from Walter Reed Army Medical Center (WRAMC). Sponsorships are available to supplement costs for food, beverages, golfing fees and prizes. The day of golfing ends with a group lunch for all the players, wounded veterans and OSC staff.

Freedom Ride - Ride Alleghany

The Freedom Ride in 2005 initiated the filing for 501 (c) 3 status for OSC. Cyclists with Ride Alleghany offered to raise money through sponsorships to benefit wounded veterans. The ride begins in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania and ends in Gaithersburg Maryland, spanning over 380 miles in four days. At the completion of the ride, participants are greeted by wounded veterans and family members at Smokey Glen Park for an old fashioned barbeque.

Marine Corps Marathon

Runners are able to join the Operation Second Chance Marathon Team, a charity partner with the Marine Corps Marathon. Runners are required to raise \$2,000 for the benefit of the organization. Training schedules and programs are available for participants to work together leading up to the race. In 2006, 24 runners represented the OSC team including soldiers deployed in Iraq at the time of the race.

Adopt A Hero Program

Families and organizations may adopt a hero, a hero's children or their entire family for the holiday season. OSC receives applications from wounded veterans and their families, both from WRAMC and their current homes. OSC also collects applications from organizations and families from across the country. Wounded veterans are matched up with organizations and families based on their needs for the holiday season. Board members and volunteers pick up all gifts and hand deliver the items before the holidays. The wounded veterans are given the names and addresses of the families and organizations that provided assistance to say thank you as well as establish a relationship, if desired.

Care Packages for Heroes

OSC collects care package items from across the country for distribution to wounded veterans recovering at WRAMC. OSC has an established list of items that is available on the website or by request. Upon receiving the various items, board members and volunteers assemble care packages based on specific needs of the wounded veterans. All care packages are hand delivered by OSC board members.

Montgomery County Fair

In 2006, OSC reserved space at the Montgomery County Fair in Gaithersburg, MD. OSC raffled off a donated gazebo to an individual attending the fair. In addition, OSC t-shirts were sold. Ideas are currently being generated for 2007.

Additional Fundraisers

Organization and communities throughout the nation have organized fundraisers to benefit OSC. Such fundraisers have included golf tournaments, soldier appreciation dinners and luncheons and care package drives.

Operation Second Chance has played an integral part in our family's recovery of my husband's injury. John was injured on November 9, 2004. I was with him, by his side, from the beginning in Germany. Our two small children, Alyssa and Pearson, did not meet up with us until a month later. I can't remember the first visit from Cindy, because there were so many. While John was in the hospital, she visited us with her friends and children. She always had a smile on her face and we looked forward to her visits. My son was a little over a year old when we got to Walter Reed. He was not walking at the time, crawling around everywhere! I was so thankful when Cindy and OSC brought us a pack'n play for the hospital. I was terrified to have him crawling around the hospital floors. It allowed the family to spend more time with daddy while he was an inpatient.

Her help didn't stop when we became an outpatient. She continued to check up on us, to see if we needed anything.
