THE PAST PRESIDENTS TOURNAMENT

At a Div. III Reps. Meeting on September 25, 1987 Gil Willams presented the following motion: At the MISGAwide 2-man Team Championship Tournaments the cumulative net scores of both partners should be added to determine a Low Net Team Champion. Also there should be a Low Gross Team Champion.

The motion was passed by the Div. III Reps. but was never fully accepted by the Board of Directors. However, it was tested at a 2-man Team Championship. It seemed to create confusion and a long delay in determining the winners.

In 1990 a group of Associates got together to try to solve the problem. Since Divisions II, III and IV were holding an annual A-B-C-D Flight Tournament, it seemed logical to try to start a separate MISGA-wide Individual Low Gross - Low Net Tournament. It was decided to name it the "Presidents Tournament" to honor all our past Presidents. To "sweeten the pot" one of the Associates offered to donate \$5000.00 to MISGA if they accepted the idea. Since I was Vice President of MISGA I was designated to be the spokesman for the group and everyone else would remain anonymous.

The only condition demanded by the group was: 1. That at least 40% of the prizes go to low gross winners and 2. That each past President shall have a prize named for him.

I typed a letter and sent it to John Turner, our President. At our Annual Reps. meeting on April 23, 1990 John asked me to explain the idea to the Reps

and Board. They approved the conditions of the letter and the Board designated first Presidents 1991 for our Tournament.

George Lipscomb, our new Tournament Chairman, was given the job of writing Instructions for the Presidents assignment Tournament. The President's names were made purely on the order in which the Presidency occurred.

Flight A - the Al Hagen Prize Flight B - the Ed Schmidt Prize Flight C - the Bill Woolston Prize

Flight D - the Herb Hudson Prize

First Low Net:

Flight A - the Sam Hastings Prize Flight B - the Gil Williams Prize

Flight C - the Francis McGee Prize Flight D - the Bob Fuchs Prize

Second Low Gross:

Flight A - the Bill Hulihan Prize Flight B - the John Turner Prize Flight C - the Merle Shumaker Prize

At a Board of Directors meeting on July 13, 1993 at Hunt Valley C. C. the Board voted to change the name of the Presidents Tournament to the "Past Presidents Tournament."
