Recording and Posting Scores in MISGA Mixers and Two-Man Tournaments

Because all of MISGA's events (except the ABCD tournaments) are "multiball" events, this article is presented to clarify the USGA-required method for recording and posting scores for those events.

Recording/Posting Mixer and MISGA Tournament Scores --

Section 5-1 of the Handicap System Book, at p. 29, states that: "<u>Scores...must be posted</u> for handicap purposes....[including] scores made...in multiball...or team competitions in which players...pick up when out of contention on a hole."

Therefore, in scoring for team competitions, such as four-person/two-best-balls events (MISGA mixers), and two-person/better-ball events (Division and State Two-Man Tournaments), a golfer who picks up his ball (because his teammate(s) already has the low score(s) for the team), must record the "most likely score" for that hole (Sec. 4-1 of the USGA Handicap System Book, p. 25).

The "most likely score" is the score the golfer would most likely have -- more than half the time -- if he had completed the hole from where he picked up the ball, subject to the equitable stroke control limit. (Sec. 2, Definitions, USGA Handicap System Book, pp. 8,9)

Post Your Score as it Appears on the Event Scorecard --

Your score on the official scorecard for the event (mixer or tournament) is the only score which may be posted. Therefore, make sure "your own" scorecard matches the official scorecard, and that you post the official scorecard score (after taking equitable stroke control into account).

Posting MISGA Tournament Scores --

Regarding the posting of MISGA tournament scores (for the Division and State ABCD and Two-Man Tournaments), the MISGA Handicap Committee noted that a large number of MISGA participants did not post their scores for those events in 2006.

Therefore, efforts will be made to ensure that participants in the 2007 MISGA tournaments (the Division and State Two-Man and ABCD Tournaments) timely post their tournament scores.

The posting of MISGA tournament scores will likely be monitored, and failure to timely post those scores may result in sanctions regarding participation in future MISGA tournaments, such as possible disqualification for participation in the current year's State Tournaments or in any MISGA tournaments in the following year.

And, remember, post your tournament scores as tournament (T) scores!

Memorable Events

Since the last issue of the 'gram', two ACES and an "almost" by MISGA associates have been reported.



The first was **Bob Dean** of the *VFW*, Div II, who scored a hole-in-one at the opening day match in April. Bob used a hybrid 4-iron on hole number 8; a 165-yard par three from an elevated tee to an elevated green. This year VFW has initiated a Hole-In-One event on hole number 8 for all matches in MISGA in order to boost membership. The prize for an ace is \$200.00 plus what is in the pot from all those who registered for the event. *VFW* plans to make visiting clubs eligible to

sign-up for the event also. On the left is a picture of Bob getting his check for \$200.00. Congratulations Bob!

The second MISGA hole-in-one reported for the 2007 season was at a four-man, two-best-ball MISGA outing on Tuesday, May 29th at *Nutters Crossing*, Div V. **Tom Wade** had his first hole in one on the par 3, 138 yard, number 14 hole at *Nutters* using his 8 iron. Hole 14 was one of the closest-to-the-pin holes and Ed Neff thought he was going to get the prize at 6 feet 5 inches until Tom aced the hole while the rest of his foursome of Bill Kleisch, Jim Weeg and Ed Yesko watched. Hole number 14 is a money hole where the players each put \$1 into the pot for a chance at a prize. Prizes are awarded for three closest-to-the-pin places and for a hole-in-one. The pot for the hole-in-one has been building and Tom won \$233.



The 'almost' hole-in-one happened at the *Piney Branch Golf Club*, Div II, on May 17, 2007. **Mike Hall**, on the 138 yard par three 9th hole, knocked the pin out of the cup. When the players teed off, the pin was in the vertical position; the exact position of the pin in the cup is unknown. When Mike's ball hit the pin, the pin fell to the ground and the ball came to rest about 5 yards from the cup back toward the tee. This event was witnessed by Dave Stone, Ivan Oshrine and Charlie Fieldhouse. We often hear, or see, of someone hitting the pin and sometimes the flag and with luck the ball drops

into the cup. To knock the pin out of the cup is a bit unusual.

Recently Deceased

Doug Berg, long time member Holly Hills and MISGA died in late May. A Memorial Service in his honor was held at Holly Hills CC on Sunday, June 3. Doug will be missed by all his golfing friends.

Retired Army Col. Francis Grant (Mac) Magrogan, former Club Rep. at Walden Golf Club, Died in May. Mac was the club rep. at Walden Golf Club and the President of the Walden Senior Men's Golf Association during he late 1990's to 2001. He was a great proponent of MISGA and did much to recruit new members as well as train many to become members of the various committees of MISGA. Mac was a lifetime member of the Maryland Army National Guard who served during the Korean and Vietnam conflicts. Mac will be sorely missed by his friends at Walden and in MISGA!
